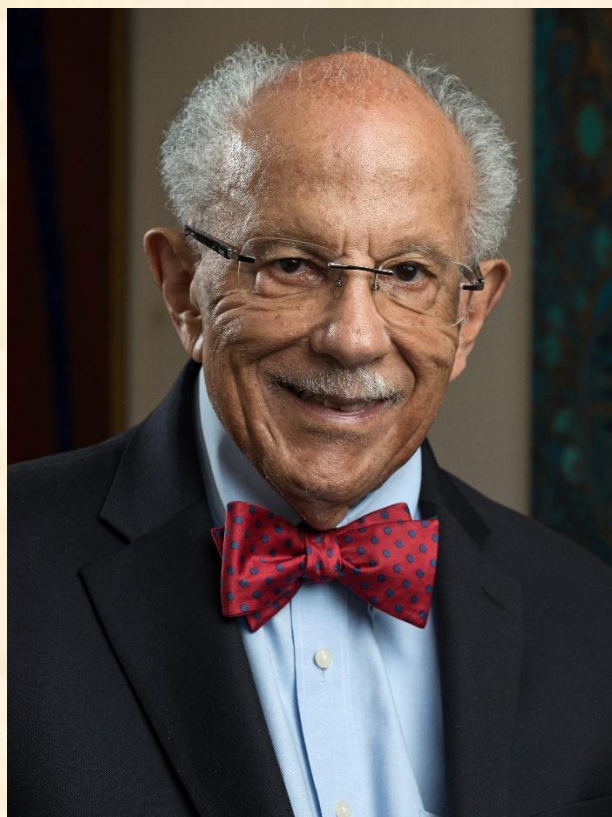


## Dr. Warren M. Washington, *Scientist/Researcher*



**Dr. Warren Morton Washington** was an American atmospheric scientist. Internationally recognized for his expertise in atmospheric sciences and climate research, he specialized in the computer modeling of Earth's climate changes. His research was part of the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change that shared the Nobel Peace Prize with Al Gore (2007). In 2019, Washington was also awarded the Tyler Prize for Environmental Achievement.

Washington was born in Portland, Oregon, in 1936. He graduated from Oregon State University with a B.S. in physics in 1958, followed by an M.S. in general science in 1960. In 1964, Washington received a doctoral degree in meteorology from Pennsylvania State University, the second African American in the United States to earn a doctorate in meteorology. Throughout his career, he was a mentor and supporter of individuals, programs, and outreach efforts which promoted diversity in science. Washington passed away at his home in 2024.
