High School Diploma



A high school diploma or GED equivalent is required to start your career as a Plans Examiner.

1

2 Years Experience



Jobs in architecture, engineering, or construction.

2 Years Education




Many community colleges offer programs that build skills in drafting, engineering, and building design.

1 Year Construction Experience & 1 Year Education



A combination of both work experience and education are sufficient to become a Plans Examiner.

ICC & OIC Certifications



Certification from the International Code Council and the Oregon Inspector Certification or State of Oregon equivalent are required to become a Plans Examiner.
